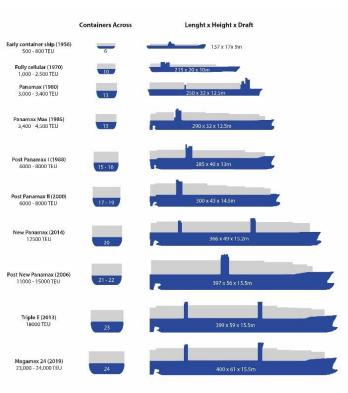

Introduction

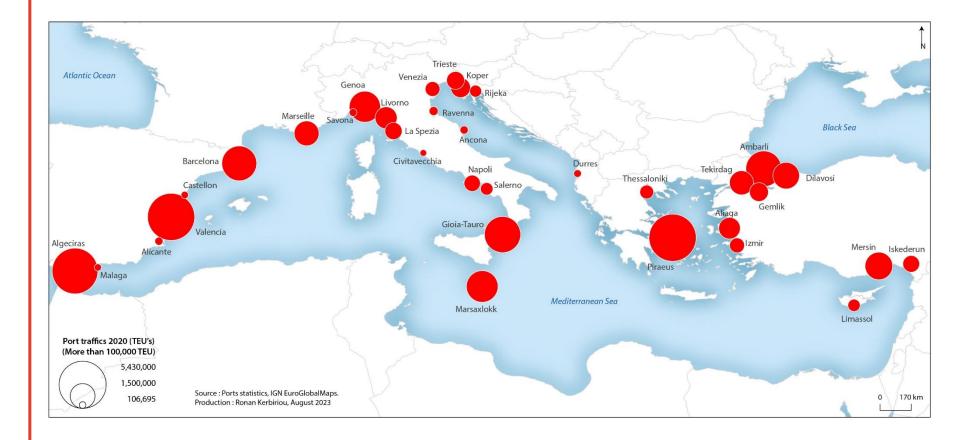
- Since the 2000s, the size of container ships has grown exponentially (8,000 TEU max in 2000 and 24,000 TEU now),
- The economic and industrial development of Southeast Asia, and China in particular, has placed this region at the heart of world trade.
- Passage through the Panama Canal was no longer necessary, and many container ship operators adapted their services.
- Containerised maritime transport has therefore developed very speedily and has undergone major upheavals in maritime organisations and operators' strategies in recent years

what is the impact of the increasing size of container ships on europe's mediterranean ports?



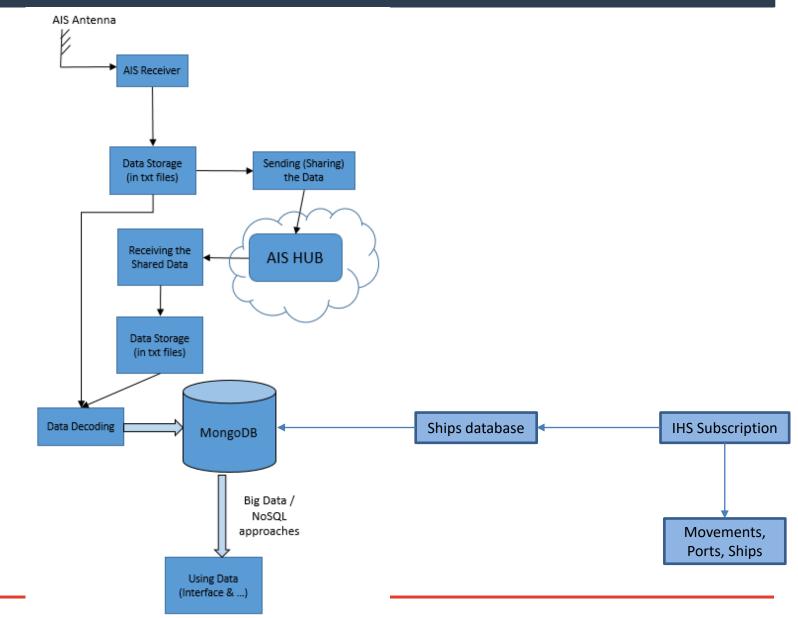

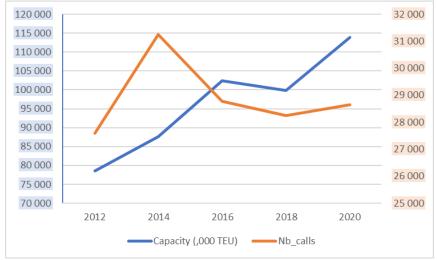

Overall approach

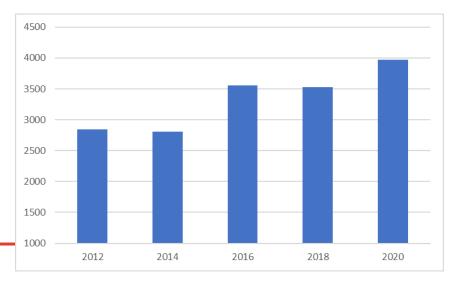
- Increase total capacity by 45% between 2012 and 2020.
- The number of calls remained stable despite a peak in 2014.
- Increase in the average size of container ships calling from 2845 TEU to 3974 TEU : + 40%

➔ significant increase in the size of container ships calling at Med-Sea ports

Number of calls and the total capacity of container ships



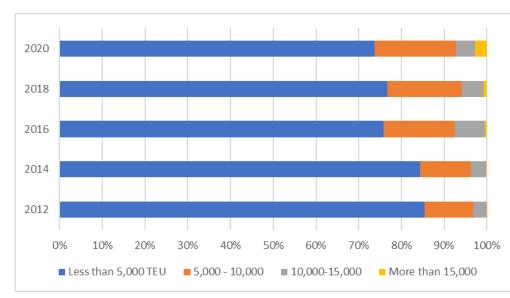
Average size of container-ships





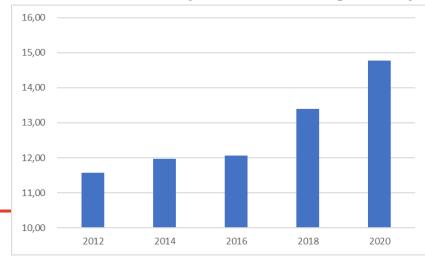
Overall approach

- Increase in the share of large ships in port calls.
- Ageing of container ships in port: from 11.6 years to 14.8 years. This is faster than the trend observed worldwide according to an UNCTAD study (11.3 in 2012 to 13.5 in 2020).

Evolution of the age of container ships calling

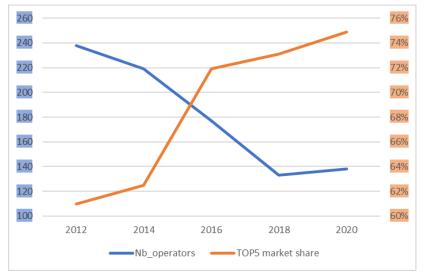




Overall approach

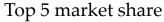
- Reduction in number of operators from 238 to 138 : -42%.
- Increase in market share for the 5 largest operators : +14 percentage points.
- Many small regional operators have disappeared or been bought up by larger operators

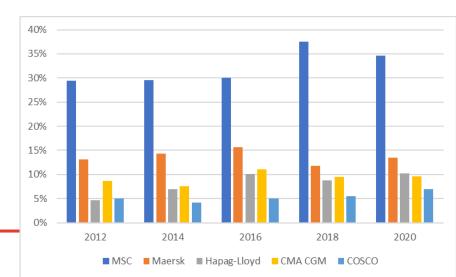
Concentration of maritime transport services.

and top 5 market share

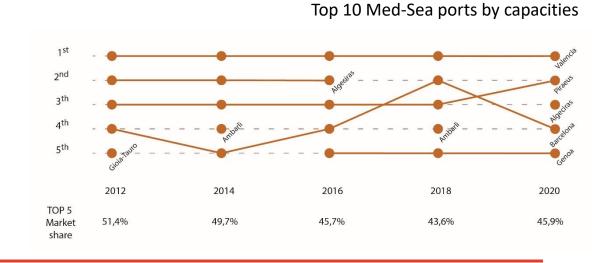




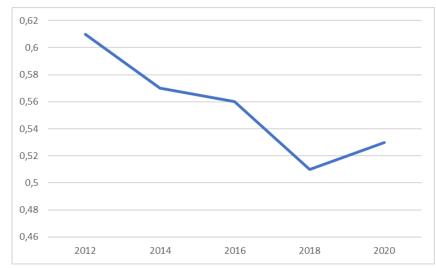


Analysis of port passage

- Gini index, decrease: better distribution of transport supply between ports.
- Analysis of top 5 market share: gradual decline except for a rebound in top 5 market share in 2020 → From 51.4% to 45.9%.

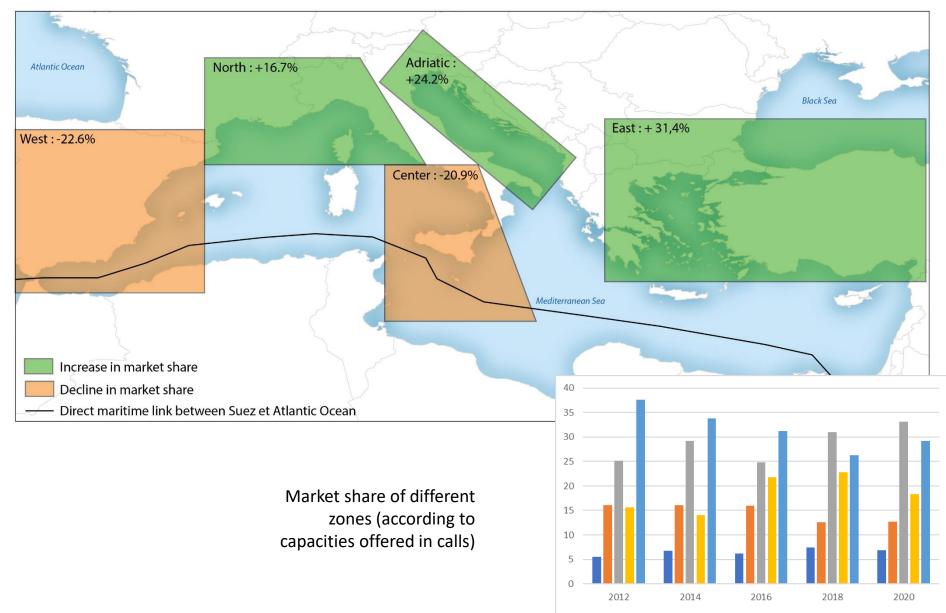


➔ Deconcentration of shipping services

Main conclusion of our analysis :

- Significant increase in the size of container ships calling at Med-Sea ports and for the total capacity;
- Increase in the share of large ships in port calls;
- Many small regional operators have disappeared or been bought up by larger operators;
- Concentration of maritime transport services;
- Deconcentration of the maritime ports services;
 - better distribution of transport supply between ports
 - Decrease in TOP 5 market share.
- Increased market share for remote ports on the direct shipping route between the Suez Canal and the Strait of Gibraltar.
